Cheaper energy bills

Australia has a housing shortage. That's why we've set an ambitious goal of building 1.2 million homes by the end of the decade.


To deliver more homes, we're training more tradies, and funding more apprenticeships. We're kickstarting construction by cutting red tape, giving \$1 billion to state governments to get homes built quickly, and delivering the biggest investment in social housing in more than a decade.

We know that building homes takes time. It won't happen overnight. But it's the best and most lasting fix to our housing shortage.

Whether you're renting, buying or building, more homes will mean more security for everyone in Aston.







Recently, I represented the Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government-The Hon. Catherine King MP, to officially open the \$10.72M multipurpose community facility at Fairpark Reserve.

After years of hard work and collaboration, this community facility has new changerooms, amenities and toilets, a social/multipurpose room, meeting rooms, classrooms, offices, storage space, a kitchen and cafeteria, and a bar.

The project was funded jointly by:

- Australian Federal Government who put in \$3 million
- Victorian State Government who put in \$50,000
- Knox City Council who contributed \$7.5 million
- AFL Victoria & Cricket Victoria who put in \$50,000 each
- Fairpark Football Club & Johnson Park Cricket Club -\$20,000 each, and
- Fairpark Netball Club & U3A Knox City Council who contributed \$10,000 each

Wiping \$3 billion in student debt

We're wiping \$3 billion in student debt for more than 3 million Australians. To do this, we're introducing HELP loan credits for people impacted by the recent inflation spike.

We're also making sure that student debt never grows faster than someone's wages or ability to pay it off. Last year's indexation spike wasn't fair; under our changes, it won't ever happen again.


A future made in Australia

We're strengthening Medicare

Everyone in Aston should have access to world-class healthcare. That's why we're providing cheaper medicines to ease the pressure on household budgets, freezing the maximum cost of a PBS medicine, and adding more medicines to the PBS.

We're investing in additional Medicare Urgent Care Clinics; expanding our network of clinics to a total of 87 locations across the country, so more Australians can benefit from bulk billed, walk-in urgent care.

We're also delivering more free mental health services, higher Medicare rebates for many common medical tests, and a \$160 million women's health package – including affordable access to longer specialist appointments for women suffering endometriosis.

A BUDGET THAT WORKS FOR WOMEN

Our Government is delivering a budget that is putting women at the centre of our economic plan to make women's lives safer, fairer and more equal.

This budget provides \$925.2 million over five years for the permanent Leaving Violence Program to deliver financial support for victim-survivors leaving a violent intimate partner relationship as well as support services for up to 12 weeks. It also directs \$1 billion towards social housing for young people and women and children fleeing violence.

Along with the \$1.2 million from the Victorian State Government, this combined \$6.2 million pavilion is fully funded and ready to be delivered by Knox City Council.
